
The depression suite is a set of six measures that track patient outcomes over six months and 12 months of an index event. An index event is the date in which the patient is eligible for the measure based on PHQ-9 score and depression diagnosis. The measures assess follow-up PHQ-9 assessment, response to depression treatment, and remission from depression. Adults residing in the Minneapolis, St. Cloud, and Willmar regions

had <u>lower</u> rates for all six depression outcome measures compared to Minnesota Resident Average*.



Black and Hispanic/Latinx adults

Adults who are **uninsured** had <u>lower</u> rates than the statewide average on all six depression outcome measures.

Adults who are on **Medicaid** had <u>lower</u> rates on five of the six depression outcome measures.
